



# EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP IN HEALTH CARE (ELH)

The Executive Leadership in Health Care (ELH) program is a one-year fellowship with extensive coaching, networking and mentoring opportunities aimed at enhancing the ability of mid-career to senior-level women leaders to bring their full potential forward at health care organizations. The ELH curriculum will predominantly focus on clinical operations and healthcare delivery.

ELH fellows learn concepts, tools and skills that enable them to thrive as leaders, following the model of our highly successful Executive Leadership in Academic Medicine® (ELAM) program. ELAM has been on the forefront of national training programs for women since 1995 and is highly regarded for developing leaders who bring exceptional value to their institutions. Fellows in the ELH program benefit from ELAM's long and proven history of advancing women leaders.

#### Candidates for ELH should be 7-10 years out of training with:

- Program level leadership
- Institutional level responsibilities (operational or strategic management)
- Aspirations to higher level health system roles (executive leadership, chief medical officer, chief quality officer)
